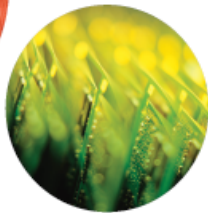


Career Connections is a joint initiative among the Governor's Office of Workforce Transformation, Ohio Board of Regents, OhioMeansJobs and Ohio Department of Education. Career Connections began in 2012 by providing a framework by which students develop a vision and realistic plan for their futures – during K-12 and beyond. Learning strategies are embedded into Ohio's New Learning Standards for English language arts, math, science and social studies. Career Connections aligns the many efforts around college and career readiness to support students in becoming productive and engaged citizens.



Career Awareness Elementary Grades (K-5)

Students become familiar with careers through learning that connects classroom instruction to future work. Career awareness strategies show students various types of careers and stimulate interest in future work.



Career Exploration Middle Grades (6-8)

Students explore their career interests through embedded activities. Career exploration strategies are opportunities for students to discover work environments and understand the various aspects of the workplace. Strategies include tools and instruments that help students understand and appreciate their strengths and interests. Students start plans for their future with career information and postsecondary education data. Plans include course selection and planning as well as career aspirations and goals.

Career Planning High School (9-12)

Students continue career exploration while focusing on career planning. Activities provide advanced experiences that offer hands-on opportunities in a workplace. Career planning strategies focus on making clear links between career options and educational decisions. Students develop the skills to revisit previous exploration and planning strategies as they face career changes throughout life.

Career Awareness

Elementary Grades (K-5)

Students become familiar with careers through learning that connects classroom instruction to future work. Career awareness strategies show students various types of careers and stimulate interest in future work.

Contemporary World Issues

Theme	<i>The dynamics of global interactions among nations and regions present issues that affect all humanity. These dynamics include competing beliefs and goals, methods of engagement, and conflict and cooperation. Contemporary issues have political, economic, social, historic and geographic components. Approaches to addressing global and regional issues reflect historical influences and multiple perspectives. Students can impact global issues through service learning and senior projects.</i>	
Topic	Civic Participation and Skills Individuals and groups have the capacity to engage with others to impact global issues.	
Content Statement	4. <i>Individuals can assess how effective communicators address diverse audiences.</i>	
<p>Content Elaborations</p> <p>As individuals engage with others on global issues, they need to be able to communicate their beliefs and ideas with other individuals and with diverse groups.</p> <p>Effective communicators, either individuals or groups, adapt communication styles to address diverse audiences by adjusting their use of communication tools, characteristics and conventions (see Content Statement 3).</p> <p>Examples of communications could include examination of school-level and personal communications (e.g., memos, letters to families, texts, Web posts), as well as pieces from news programs, websites, advertisements or other media students may see in their daily life. For example, news clips may be used to illustrate how politicians use different body language when speaking to different audiences.</p> <p>Opportunities should be provided for students to practice their own communication skills as they engage with others on global issues.</p> <p>Expectations for Learning</p> <p>Assess and practice effective communication methods.</p>	<p>Instructional Strategies</p> <p>Have students select a person in the public spotlight and assess how effectively the person communicates. <i>How does this person adjust their communication style for diverse audiences? What tools, characteristics or conventions were most or least effective? Why are some people more dynamic than others when speaking?</i></p> <p>Ask students, <i>What does it take to be an effective communicator?</i> Students can brainstorm practices that they expect to see in an effective communicator then look for those characteristics as they observe selected video clips.</p> <p>Career Connection</p> <p>Students will brainstorm practices that they expect to see in an effective communicator then look for those characteristics as they observe selected video clips (e.g., Ted Talks at www.ted.com/talks). After viewing videos of three dynamic speakers, students will reflect on how communications skills are essential across all types of jobs (e.g., hospitality, IT, health). 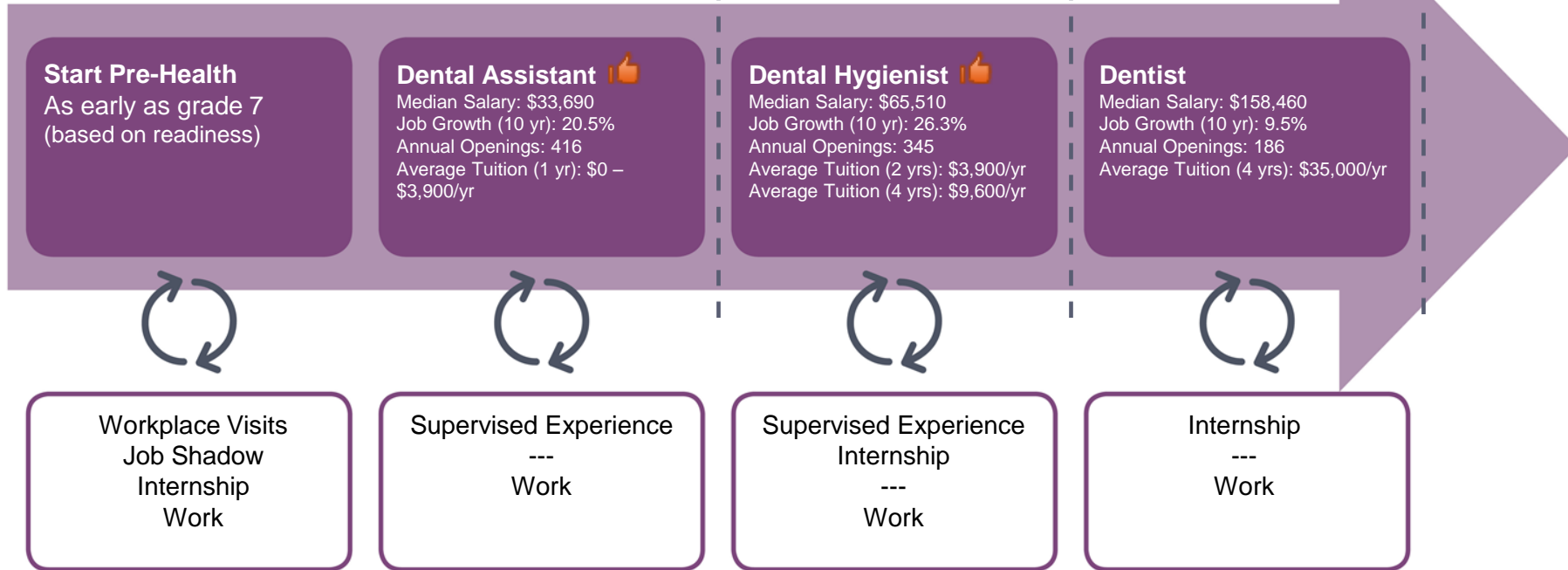

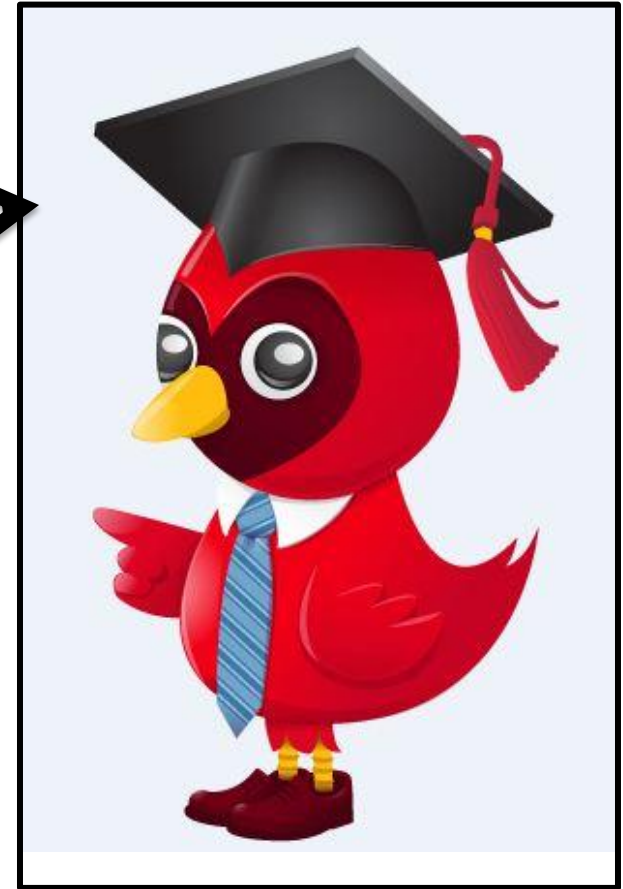

- Clean calcareous deposits, accretions, and stains from teeth and beneath margins of gums, using dental instruments.
- Record and review patient medical histories.
- Examine gums, using probes, to locate periodontal recessed gums and signs of gum disease.
- Feel and visually examine gums for sores and signs of disease.
- Expose and develop x-ray film.
- Chart conditions of decay and disease for diagnosis and treatment by dentist.
- Maintain dental equipment and sharpen and sterilize dental instruments.
- Feel lymph nodes under patient's chin to detect swelling or tenderness that could indicate presence of oral cancer.
- Provide clinical services or health education to improve and maintain the oral health of patients or the general public.
- Apply fluorides or other cavity preventing agents to arrest dental decay.
- Maintain patient recall system.
- Administer local anesthetic agents.
- Remove excess cement from coronal surfaces of teeth.
- Conduct dental health clinics for community groups to augment services of dentist.
- Place and remove rubber dams, matrices, and temporary restorations.
- Remove sutures and dressings.
- Make impressions for study casts.
