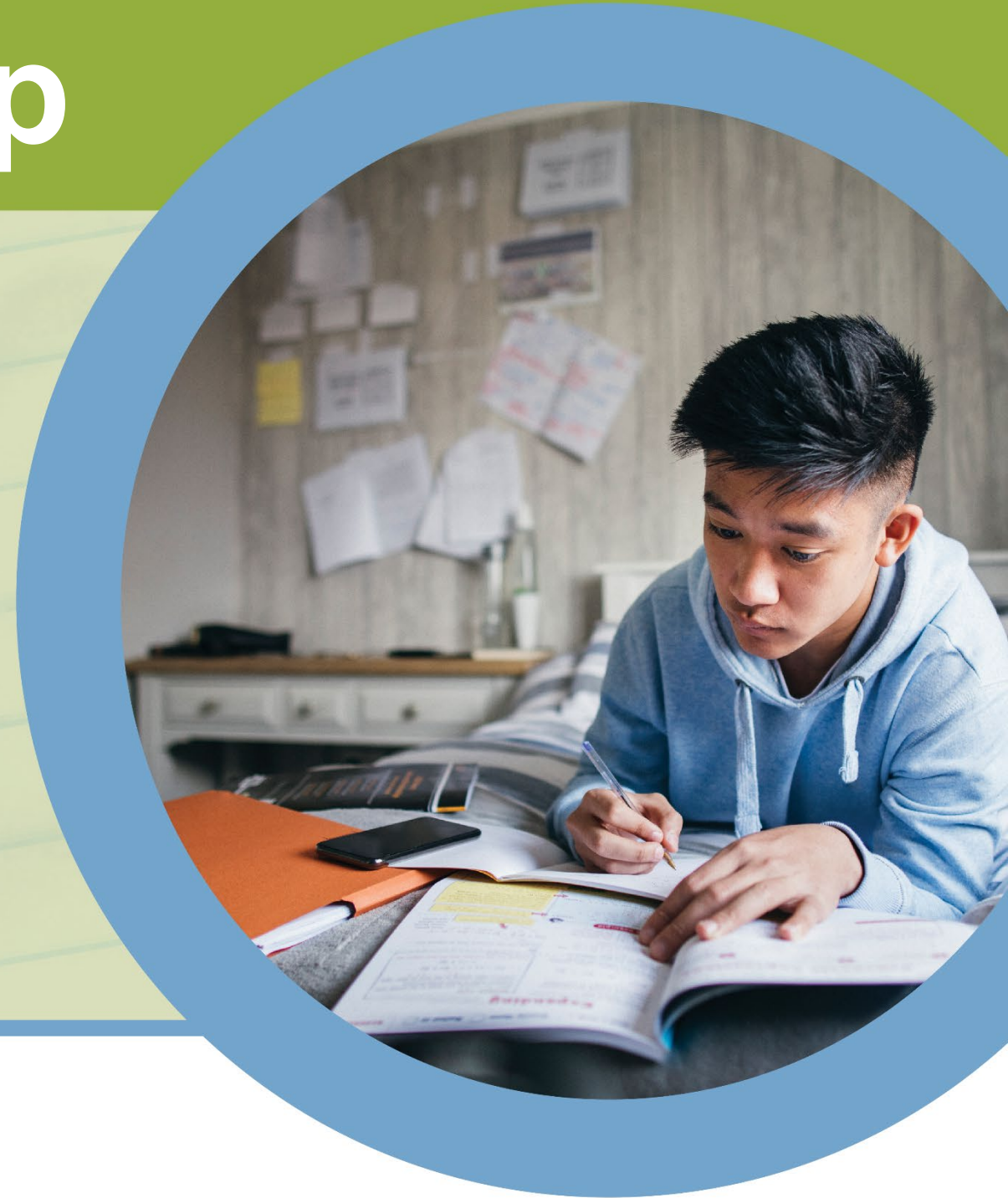

 - Be able to use Early Warning System next school year

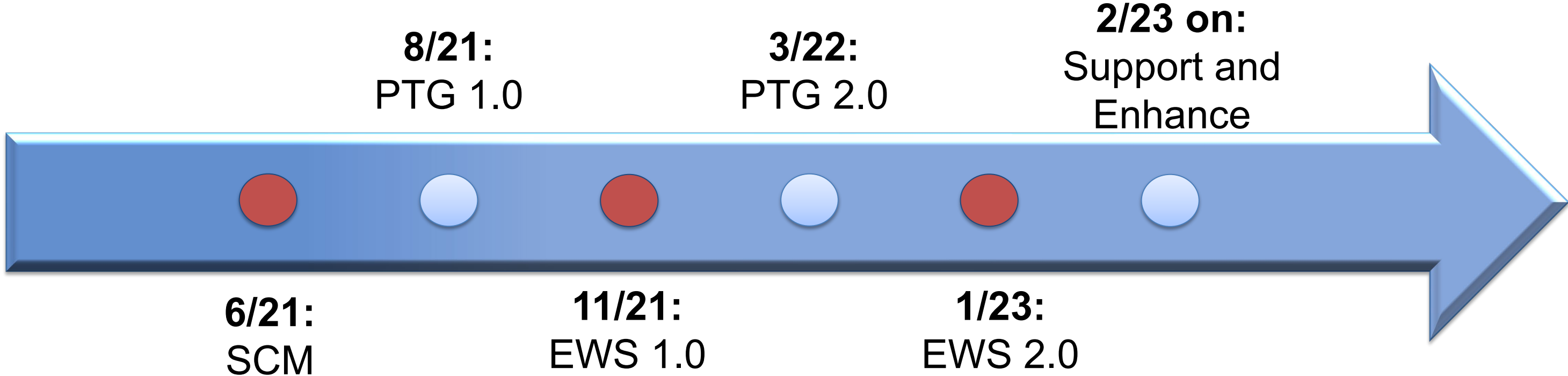
Three Major Modules

Progress Towards Graduation Updates

- Analysis of data to be included in reports presents some challenges
 - Mis-coding of credits earned
 - Especially with Advanced Science credits
 - Also some issues with Math/Algebra
 - Recording non-credit experiences
 - Fine Arts and Financial Literacy
 - Physical Education exemption

Students will demonstrate competency in the foundational areas of English language arts and mathematics by earning a passing score of 684 on Ohio's high school Algebra I and English II tests. If students do not earn this score after remediation and a second attempt at the test, they may demonstrate competency in another way (see "Competency Alternatives.")

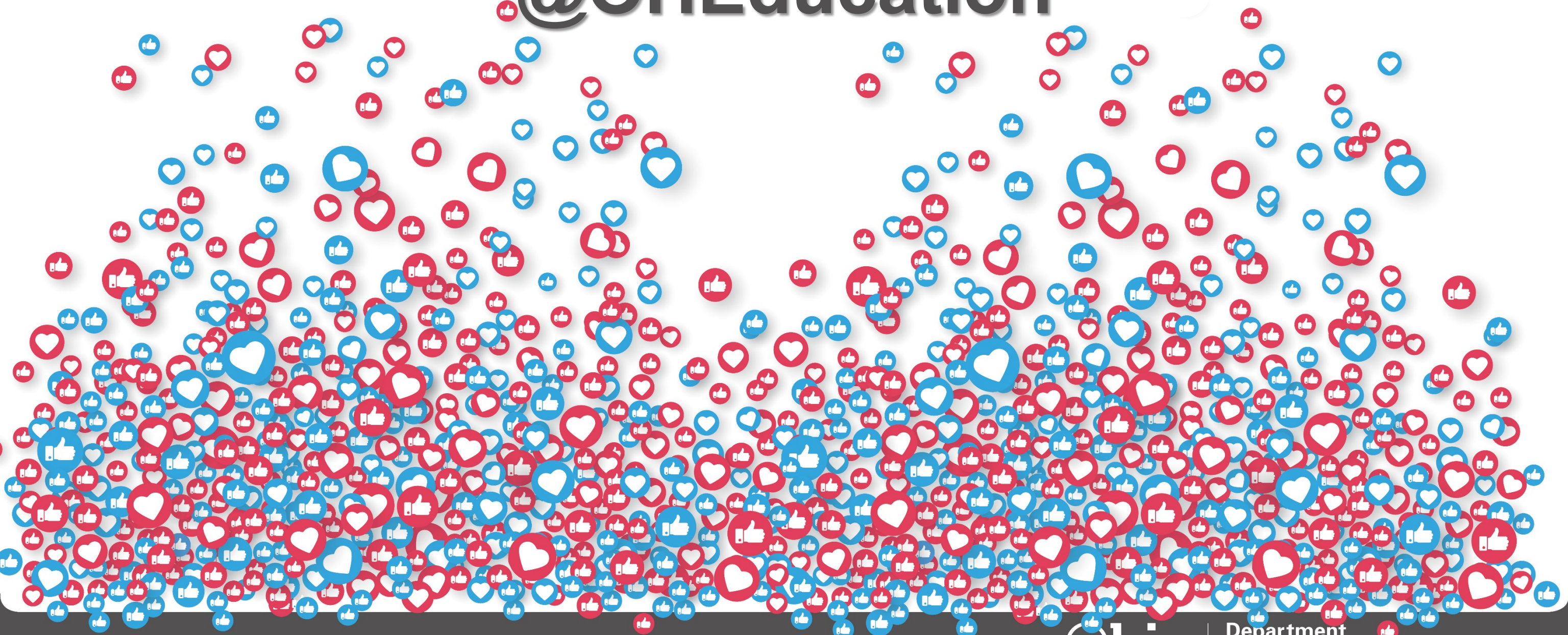
